What is new is that many more grandparents are increasingly becoming the primary caregivers when difficult family situations arise. When these caregivers take on this awesome responsibility, they may find that the landscape has changed, and they often receive little to no support. At last count, more than 26,200 grandparents in NM were responsible for the children living with them.
