Committee Goal:



Improve response to an individual in behavioral health crisis and link them to appropriate stabilization and recovery services while minimizing involvement with the criminal justice system.



How

- Insure individuals and families experiencing a behavioral health crisis can access immediate care.
- Reduce use of hospital emergency rooms for behavioral health crisis.
- Divert individuals who experience a behavioral health crisis from incarceration to appropriate treatment.

Existing Crisis Services

- o Crisis Call Center: New Mexico Crisis and Access Line
 - Bernalillo County Emergency Communications currently collaborating with NMCAL to route appropriate calls.
 - Bernalillo County Fire and Bernalillo County Sheriffs Departments connecting community members on scene with NMCAL and providing resources to those in need.
 - Department of Addiction Treatment Services currently connecting appropriate clients with NMCAL in addition to existing protocols.
 - COA Emergency Communications currently exploring NMCAL Collaboration and referral.

o Crisis Intervention Units: APD and BCSO

- Crisis Intervention Training
- Mental Health First Aid

PROJECTS

APPROVED TO DATE

- Mobile Crisis Teams
 - Clinician/ Law Enforcement Model
 - APD/BCSO/DPS

Transition Planning, Resource and Re-entry Center

- Transition planning begins at MDC following clients through release
- Creates a front door into a network of services



PROJECTS

IN REVIEW

- o Crisis Respite Services/ Intermediate Levels of Care
 - Step down services for individuals who need continued behavioral health stabilization

PROPOSED

- Crisis Stabilization Center
 - Request for Information





OUTCOMES

- SHORT-TERM
 - Connect community with most appropriate crisis intervention resource for immediate care
 - Provide resources for clients and family
- LONG-TERM
 - Increased utilization of non-crisis resources
 - Increased referral and connectivity to behavioral health continuum and services
 - Reduced Involvement with the Criminal Justice System
 - Reduced Reliance on Emergency Medical and Behavioral Health Services
