- Answers to questions about any type of poison or medication.
- Information about poison prevention.

Poison experts are ready to take your call.

 Pharmacists specially trained in the management of poisoning emergencies and doctors specializing in medical toxicology will answer your call and tell you what to do.

Our services include:

- Two telephone services: (1) a poison hotline and (2) a drug information line.
 - Both at the same number: **1-800-222-1222**
 - Both are free, confidential and open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year
 - Both are open to all New Mexicans
 - Both are offered in over 70 different languages, including Navajo
 - Both offer services for the hearing impaired

- Exact name of the product involved (have the container close at hand)
- Amount of the poison the person was
- Any symptoms

exposed to

• Time of exposure

- Food poisoning
- Drug and substance abuse
- incidents
- Age and weight of the person
- Any health problems the person has
- Any treatment that has been given
