- Early Childhood (PreK-3)
- General Education Elementary (K-8)
- General Education Secondary (7-12)
- Special Education (PreK-12)

The Alternative Teacher Licensure Program (ATLP) at CNM is a state accredited post-baccalaureate program for individuals interested in becoming a certified teacher in New Mexico.

Upon *acceptance* into our program, individuals are eligible to apply for a 2-year Alternative Level I License from the New Mexico Public Education Department (NMPED) and may teach while taking coursework toward full licensure.

The Teacher Licensure Program coursework is reserved for those who have been accepted into the Program.

The <u>Teacher Licensure Program application</u> includes:

- Applying to CNM as a "non-degree student"
- Electronic submission of official transcript to CNM Records Office confirming award of a Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
- *Submission of passing scores on <u>NES Essential Academic Skills</u> or the <u>Praxis Core Academic Skills</u> for <u>Educators</u>:
- GPA of 3.0 on highest degree earned (or passing score on an appropriate content exam)
- Ability to pass a Criminal Background Check

*Passing results from a comparable out of state teacher assessment completed within the past 10 years will be accepted.

Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis and are screened within 14 business days of receipt of a completed application. Applications and supporting documents – including official transcripts and passing test results - must be turned in by the application deadline.
