ACCOUNTABLE HEALTH COMMUNITIES

Addressing the social determinants of health

- New 5-year, \$4.5 million cooperative agreement through CMS
- Screen and refer Medicaid and Medicare beneficiaries Housing
 - Food insecurity
 - Utility assistance
 - Transportation
 - Safety
- Examine the impact on cost and quality of care
- 75,000 people screened a year at multiple health care locations (hospitals, FQHCs, community dental)

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Our vision: By 2020 all Santa Fe County residents regardless of income have access to high quality health care and are linked to the resources they need for health and well-being.



From June through December 2017:

- 181 individuals have received navigation services
- 556 Social Determinants of Health have been addressed
- \$4551 of Flex Funding has been used

It is estimated that over 2000 people will receive navigation services in Santa Fe County by June 2019.


ACCOUNTABLE HEALTH COMMUNITY GOALS



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


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GAP ANALYSIS

- Identify:
 - Need/demand
 - Service supply and Utilization
 - Missing or under resourced services and structural barriers for each of the five areas



GAP ANALYSIS

- Utilize existing needs assessments, surveys, annual reports and program data from partners and social service providers around Bernalillo County to deepen understanding of needs and gaps
- Maximize use of Share NM's resource directory and GIS mapping to analyze geographic gaps and barriers
- Update annually with screening and navigation data collected through NowPow

QUALITY IMPROVEMENT

- Collect and analyze in real time AHC program data for continuous quality improvement to screening, navigation and social service response
- Identify areas where alignment of social services already exist and new opportunities for alignment
- Update annually with coalition led ideas and actions for increased coordination and alignment between social service agencies, government entities, MCO's and clinical partners to address gaps in service, needed resources to address large influx of new referrals.

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GAP ANALYSIS

- 8 town halls: various county locations targeting different populations and topics to include seniors, the Spanish speaking community, behavioral health and children and families
- 5 provider group interviews: topics ranged from first responders to behavioral and physical health, early childhood, housing and food
- PRIORITIES IDENTIFIED: Housing, Behavioral Health, Services for Seniors, and Navigating and Enhancing the Existing System
