## **HEALTHY HERE INITIATIVE (HHI)**

Works to change systems and environments to reduce health disparities among Hispanic and Native American residents in Albuquerque's South Valley and International District.

#### Impact in 2020:

- \* 3 community wide active living intervention pop up events
- \* Virtually engaged 55 persons in active living activities
- 100 persons enrolled and engaged in English and Spanish WWE self-directed programs
- Hosted 2 community mindfulness and wellbeing walks during COVID19





## PUBLIC HEALTH INITIATIVE (PHI)

The Public Health Policy Initiative is a collaboration with the City of Albuquerque set in place to promote upstream community health strategies throughout Bernalillo County.

## LOCAL GROWING INITIATIVE

Supports food equity and justice in Albuquerque's South Valley and International District through soil testing, mycoremediation, advocacy, and front yard gardens



- Conducted 20 Soil tests in the ID and South Valley
- \* Assisted with 10 community/shared harvest gardens
- Provided 10+ Environmental Justice Workshops
- Offered Educational Videos YouTube sunflowersforchange channel
- \* Monthly Food Distributions
- Facilitated of Growing Health and Justice Coalition Meetings and Bernalillo County Urban Ag Meetings

## CIQLOVIA

A free event designed to encourage all burqueños and visitors to get active and enjoy our beautiful city and unique neighborhoods on foot or by bike. 213 residents enjoyed the activities in 2020 with 13 different recharge locations available to participants.

Addressing the Opioid Overdose Epidemic in our Community

#### **Prevention**

- \*Safe opioid prescribing awareness and education
- \*Community prevention and awareness campaign

#### Harm Reduction

- \*Naloxone (Narcan) education and training
- \*Outreach
- \*Progressive policies that reach at-risk populations

## Access to treatment

- \* elivehealth.com and the elive health mobile app connecting those living with opioid use disorder to available treatment
- Promoting greater access to medication assisted treatment

## Law Enforcement & Criminal Justice

- \*Promoting diversion programs that refer addiction behavior to treatment rather than incarceration
- \*Public health approaches to addressing substance use disorder in the criminal justice system

# PREVENT PRESCRIPTION DRUG/OPIOID OVERDOSE RELATED DEATHS (PDO) PROJECT

- \* Naloxone Distribution
- \* Free overdose prevention training to first responders, service providers and community members
- Platform for collaboration. networking and community input regarding harm reduction strategies



# ALBUQUERQUE-BERNALILLO **COUNTY ABC) PREVENT**

Working together to reduce underage drinking and prescription opioid misuse among Bernalillo County children, youth and young adults



- Among New Mexico high school students in 2019, 11.3% reported having used prescription pain medicine inappropriately in the past 30 days. (NM-YRRS, 2019)
- \* In 2019, New Mexico high school students had the third highest rate of any state participating in the CDC's Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) for drinking alcohol before the age of 13. (NM-YYRS, 2019)

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## ANTI-STIGMA PROJECT

The Council facilitates guided conversation around stigma and the invisible barriers to healing and treatment for someone living with opioid use disorder. We are also expanding to other substances and have reached over 100 New Mexico residents in 2020.
