

Current information for Artists and Cultural Workers Updated 4/14/20

According to <u>a study</u> by UNM's Bureau of Business and Economic Research New Mexico's cultural economy employs over 76,000 workers (10% of NM's workforce) and contributes \$5.6 million to NM's economy. The core of this economy are the 6,000 independent artists, writers, and performers, almost all of whom are self-employed.

Artists and cultural venues have been hit hard by the COVID-19 emergency, with cancellations of events and exhibits, and closings of gallery and other opportunities to market the arts. In addition to the resources available to self-employed, independent contractors and gig economy workers, special relief funds have been established for artists.

Emergency Relief for Artists – New Mexico

<u>New Mexico Arts</u> has a host of resources for individual artists and for arts organizations.

<u>The New Mexico Musicians Relief Fund (NMMRF)</u> helps musicians in NM who are financially impacted by cancellations due to COVID-19. The fund gives priority to artists of color, LGBTQ+ and non-binary artists, and disabled or immunocompromised artists, but they intend to help as many artists in need as they can. <u>Fulcrum Fund</u>, administered by 516 Arts in Albuquerque, is also providing emergency relief grants to local artists. They are accepting <u>donations</u> due to overwhelming demand.

Culture Connects Coalition and the Lannan Foundation have partnered to form the <u>Artist Relief Fund</u> to help Santa Fe artists residing in Santa Fe County. The first round of grant applications has closed. The next round of rolling applications will begin May 4 at 8:00 AM.

Santa Fe Community Foundation <u>Artist Medical Fund</u> helps address problems encountered by professional artists who are uninsured and liable to serious financial difficulties in the case of medical emergencies.

Emergency Relief for Artists – National

<u>Artist Relief</u> is an initiative organized by a number of small to mid-sized national arts grantmakers to help support the financial, professional, social, and mental well-being of artists impacted by the coronavirus public health crisis. The initiative will distribute grants of \$5,000 to practicing artists living in all fifty states, territories, and tribal nations who are facing dire financial emergencies due to COVID-19. The initiative will operate through September, as organizers monitor the impact of the pandemic and continue to fundraise to assist with the ongoing needs of the country's artists. <u>Writers Emergency Fund</u>, sponsored by PEN America, is expanding its Writers' Emergency Fund to support the literary community at this time. PEN America will distribute grants of \$500 to \$1,000 based on applications that demonstrate an inability to meet an acute financial need, especially one resulting from the impact of the COVID-19 outbreak.
