Housing Vouchers

Two separate Albuquerque Housing Authority (AHA) housing programs are now accepting preapplications for a limited time:

- **Apply Now** for the *Housing Choice* Section 8 vouchers (HCV) lottery, which is open June 1-30 for online only pre-applications.
- **Apply Now** for Project-Based Vouchers (PBV) by submitting an online pre-application. (Project-Based means that these are vouchers for <u>designated properties</u> only).

Rent Assistance

Up to 3 months of rental assistance is available to **families with children** who have experienced COVID-19 related job loss. Applications must come from landlords or agencies serving eligible families. Download the <u>information sheet and application</u>. Return the application with a completed <u>W-9</u> for the organization.

The City's four health and social services centers currently have COVID-19 emergency rent assistance funds from the City of ABQ and private donations for people residing within the City of Albuquerque. This is by appointment only; walk-ins are not allowed. Call the center in your quadrant of the city. If you don't know which center serves your residence address, you can call any of them to find out:
