## **Median Household Income**

**Definition:** Median annual household income is the income level at which half of all households' income is

lower, and half of all households' income is higher.

# **Owner-Occupied Housing Units**

**Definition:** The homeownership rate is computed by dividing the number of owner-occupied housing units by the number of occupied housing units or households. A housing unit is owner-occupied if the owner or co-owner lives in the unit, even if it is mortgaged or not fully paid for.

**Definition:** The estimated percentage of persons living in households whose income is at or below the federal poverty level. Poverty status is determined by comparing household income to poverty thresholds (income cutoffs). Thresholds vary by family size and number of children under 18 in the household. For instance, the poverty level for a family of four in 2018 is \$24,600. The U.S. Poverty Guidelines may be found at the <u>Health and Human Services website</u>.

#### **EARLY CHILDHOOD**

#### Children Enrolled in Preschool

**Definition:** Percent of children age 3-4 who are enrolled in a preschool, including any institution or program providing educational experiences for 3- to 4-year-old children, such as nursery school, preschool, pre-K, Head Start, and kindergarten. Private homes that primarily provide custodial care are not included.
